# Great Plains Quarterly Style Sheet for Figures, Maps, and Photographs

## Permissions

- 1. Please include complete permission information for all illustrations. Written permission from the institution or individual holding the copyright for all illustrations must be provided before publication.
- 2. All costs for obtaining and reprinting images will be the responsibility of the author.

## Captions

1. All captions should be concise and include source and permission information. Please indicate insertion or page range in your manuscript.

## Figures

- 1. All figures should be referenced in the text according to page 2-3 of the Style Sheet.
- 2. All figures should be 2 5/8 in. wide (1-column width) or 5 5/8 in. wide (2-column width) and no more than 7  $\frac{1}{2}$  in. tall so there is room for a caption under the figure.
- 3. All figures should be submitted as black and white grayscale images. Please do not submit any figures or maps in color unless you obtain prior permissions from the editor.
- 4. Please send original photos to us for scanning. Many agencies now prefer to make scanned photos, in which case, request the scans on a CD-Rom and send it to us with the permission form, a printed copy, and the captions. Scanned images must be a minimum of 300 ppi.
- 5. Do not insert graphic files into your article. Do not send figures as computer slide presentation graphics or word processing graphics.

#### Electronic artwork

- 1. We accept line art and halftones on disk. If you are supplying the images on disk, please include a directory of files contained on the disk and a hard copy printout of each figure. Hard copy must match the digital file.
- 2. Halftone images should be scanned at a minimum of 300 pixels per inch (ppi). Line art should be scanned at 1200 ppi. Please note that nearly all images downloaded from or saved for the Internet or PowerPoint<sup>™</sup> are in JPEG or GIF format and will be 72 dpi and are not acceptable for the printing process.
- 3. If you are submitting images in color, you must have approval from the editor.
- 4. Halftones should have end dot settings of 2% in the lightest area of the image and 98% in the darkest.
- 5. Indicate the file format of the graphics. We accept TIFF or EPS format.
- 6. We prefer you use a Times Roman font style in your figures.

#### Maps

- 1. Be sure you have placed a distance scale on your maps. Distance should be listed with a north arrow on the map.
- 2. Enlarged details of maps should reflect the same area and shape of the map.
- 3. Geographic places mentioned in the text should be shown on a map.
